Need help?

SHFB has over 60 partner agencies throughout the tri-county service area. This includes hot meal sites, soup kitchen, and on-site pantries. You might have a food pantry within walking distance and not even know it! These partner agencies are open at a variety of dates and times, making food more accessible to you and your family.



Mobile Distributions – Walkup and Drive-thru mobile distributions focused in neighborhoods, rural areas and food deserts, are designed to allow neighbors to choose the food they want for them and their family.



Emergency Food Box Pickup - Individuals in need of emergency food assistance can visit our warehouse and get food without waiting for a mobile distribution or pantry.



Home Delivery – Food delivery is provided directly to the doorsteps of neighbors who are disabled, medically fragile, lacking transportation and/or 60 years of age or older.



OrderAhead – Expands access to charitable food through a discreet and convenient click-and-collect grocery ordering system that reduces the physical and social barriers encountered by neighbors facing food insecurity.



Senior Box – A monthly box of food is provided to low-income seniors 60 years of age or older.



Community Markets – markets are located at schools, hospitals and senior living facilities to provide an easily accessible source of food assistance to individuals and their families.



Summer Food Service Program and Weekend Backpack – Nutritious, kid-friendly food is provided for the weekend for atrisk children in school grades K-12, as well as at summer meal program sites.



Community Response Center – We have staff available to help you. Assistance is provided to help community members apply for state-funded social and health services, including SNAP, Medicaid, WIC and others.



Agency Membership – Our distribution partners make up a network of markets that provide local access to food and other essential items for our neighbors and their families.
